

What is Upload Speed and Why is it Important?

You and the family are on vacation and want to check in on your house through a virtual security camera system like Google Nest or Ring Doorbell. But what happens if your home's Internet connection doesn't have fast enough upload speed to get that video feed to you? 503-845-7101 Systems like this require a fair amount of upload speed in order to transfer live video feeds to the Internet to be viewed on a smartphone or other mobile device. You won't be able to see that security feed and know that your home is safe.

Most Internet service providers only showcase a single number when advertising their connection speeds. That number is known as the download speed and denotes the bandwidth that is used for the following tasks:


- Stream HD video
- Load a web page to view
- Stream music
- Scroll through social media apps like Instagram or Facebook 503-266-1119

Often overlooked is a connection's upload speed, which is crucial to perform a variety of tasks including:

- Streaming live video feeds from a home security system (2 Mbps **per** camera) 503-845-2657
- Sending large files via email (1 Mbps)
- Video calling (1-2 Mbps per stream)
- Playing online multiplayer games (1 Mbps per user)
- Smartphone automatic backups over WiFi

How to Reduce the Amount of Spam in Your Inbox

Did you know that spam email makes up 45% of all email messages received? Spam, or junk email, is unsolicited messages sent in bulk to many recipients at once. It often consists of sales items or pitches aimed at getting the receiver to take an action, like visit a website. Short of cutting yourself off from the Internet, there's no way to eliminate spam entirely. But there are steps you can take to reduce how much of it you see:

1 Train Your Filter

When you find spam in your inbox, don't just delete it. Select it and tell your email provider (GMail, Outlook, Hotmail), that this particular message is spam. How you do this depends on the program you use to read email. If you have a DirectLink email account (@canby.com), report a message as spam by clicking on the "Report Spam" button above your messages.



2 Never Respond to Spam

If you recognize something as spam, don't open it. If you open it and then realize it's spam, close it. Do not click a link or a button, or download a file, from a message that you even remotely suspect is spam. If you opened a spam message because it appeared to be coming from a friend or co-worker, contact them immediately and let them know that their account may have been compromised.

3 Hide Your Email Address

The more people who have your email address, the more spam you're going to get. Don't publish it on the web unless absolutely necessary and use a different address for that purpose.

Know what's **below. Call** before you dig.

If you plan to begin any project that involves digging — such as building a patio, putting up a fence, or planting bushes and trees — remember to call 811 before work begins.

Every digging job requires a call to 811 to have underground utility lines marked. In some cases, lines are buried close to the surface and could easily be damaged by even shallow digging, resulting in service interruptions to your neighborhood.

When you call, simply tell the operator where you're planning to dig and what type of work you'll be doing. 503-845-7571 The affected local utilities will send a locator to your property, free of charge. Then you'll know what's below and be able to dig safely.

Change or Diversify Your Passwords

It is a great time to update your passwords.

Weak and common passwords are easy for hackers to guess, and this opens the door for others to read your email, spoof your information, and gain access to your other online accounts such as banking and credit cards.

You need long and strong passwords to be protected online. We recommend that all your passwords meet these criteria:

- Minimum of 16 characters
- Contains at least one uppercase letter and one number 503-651-1765
- Uses one or more punctuation marks such as (.), (-), (#) or (!)
- Do not include your name or username



It's also important not to use the same password for multiple online accounts. 503-845-6160 If that password is cracked, other passwords could be compromised as well.

To help organize all those passwords, check out **www.last-pass.com** or a similar password management tool. Last-Pass is a secure and effective tool to help manage your abundance of passwords. One super-strong password protects all of your others behind the "vault" so you don't have to remember them all. Plus, LastPass can be added as an extension to Chrome, Firefox, Edge, Internet Explorer, Safari, or other browser to automatically fill in login details.



Need to save battery on your smartphone? Turn on Airplane Mode to deactivate cellular connectivity. 503-263-2027 You won't receive calls or texts and won't be able to connect to the Internet using your data, thus extending the battery life.



Q&A

Question: Why don't some of my devices run quickly even though I have a high-speed Internet connection?

Answer: Internet connections offered by DirectLink can be as fast as 1,000 Mbps (1 Gigabit), but ultimately depend on the member's equipment capabilities. For example, if one tried to load a web page on an iPhone 6 while connected to their home WiFi, and then on an iPhone X, the newer device will likely load much faster. 503-263-6175 Despite both being connected to the same high-speed Internet network, the newer iPhone has more advanced internal processing capabilities that allow it to run more smoothly and efficiently.

Here are some other reasons why you may not experience the fastest activity on your high-speed connection:

- The old WiFi router or equipment in your home may not support Gigabit Internet speeds, thus limiting access to higher speeds.
- The device(s) is too far away from the WiFi access point for a strong signal. Larger homes, older homes, and some objects like thick mirrors and microwaves can decrease the signal strength as well. 503-845-6821 If this is your experience, consider a commercial-grade WiFi Home Networking solution from DirectLink starting at just \$6 per month. Let us take care of your network and make sure that it's optimized to provide the strongest, most consistent signal in every room of your home.
- The device(s) may have slowed down with age. Most Internet-connected devices, like smartphones, laptops, and tablets, undergo regular software updates that are meant to improve functionality. 503-845-2251 However, when these updates are applied to older devices, they can sometimes slow down the device because the older technology was not necessarily designed to be able to support hefty new updates. For example,

- computers purchased before the Windows 7 operating system will likely not be able to support current updates and will run more slowly.
- The device(s) need to be rebooted. Often a simple power cycle will remedy many issues related to lag or slow activities. Turn the device(s) off, wait 30 to 60 seconds, then power it back on.

What should I do if I experience any of the above?

Conduct a wired speed test via SpeedTest.net (on a computer that is plugged directly into the wall via an Ethernet connection, for example) to see exactly what speeds your network delivers. 503-845-6226 Then, check your WiFi equipment if it is not leased from DirectLink to make sure it is not too old to support high speeds. 503-651-3116 Finally, take a look at the devices connected to the network and verify that they have the capability to perform tasks on a high-speed connection.

Be On The Lookout For The "One Ring" Phone Scam

Via the Federal Communications Commission

For illegal robocallers, the goal isn't always having you answer. Sometimes, it's just to get a call back.

Every so often, your phone may ring once and then stop. If that happens, and you do not recognize the number, do not return the call. This may be an attempt at a "one-ring" phone scam.

One-ring calls may appear to be from phone numbers somewhere in the United States, including three initial digits that resemble U.S. area codes. But savvy scammers often use international numbers from regions that also begin with three-digit codes – for example, "649" goes to the Turks and Caicos and "809" goes to the Dominican Republic. 503-266-7477 Such scammers may often use spoofing techniques as well to further mask the number on a caller ID display.


By calling any such number, you risk being connected to a location outside the U.S. As a result, you may wind up being charged a fee for connecting, along with significant per-minute fees for as long as they can keep someone on the line. These charges may show up on your phone bill as premium services.

503-845-6136 Variations of this scam rely on phony voice mail messages that urge a call back to a number with an unfamiliar area code to "collect a prize" or notifications about a "sick" relative.

How to avoid this scam:

- **DO NOT** answer or return any calls from numbers you don't recognize. Let them leave a message.
- Before calling unfamiliar numbers, check online or in the phone book to see if the area code is international.
- If you do not make international calls, ask the phone company to block outgoing international calls on your line.
- Always be cautious, even if a number appears authentic.

DirectLink now offers a Voice feature that blocks most of these types of scam calls from reaching you. Call the local office to ask us about adding Robocall Blocking or log onto SmartHub at **DirectLink.SmartHub.coop** to persoanlly add it to your account.
